

FOR PARENTS: HOW TO APPLY

If you are interested in obtaining a SCOPE scholarship; please follow these steps:

1. Choose camps that would best suit the child attending. Information about each camp can be found on their websites listed here, or by calling the camps for their brochures.
2. Contact the camps and request a **SCOPE application**. A SCOPE application cannot be obtained from the SCOPE office.
3. Fill out and return the application to the **camp** you have selected. **PLEASE DO NOT SEND APPLICATIONS TO SCOPE**
4. The camps will contact you if they have a scholarship available and will give you further information about preparing your child for camp. All questions should be directed to the camps.

To be eligible to participate in SCOPE, campers must meet the following requirements:

- Be 7 – 16 years old
- Meet family income eligibility requirements established by the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture for free or reduced-priced school lunch
- Complete an application essay expressing their desire and motivation to go to a residential camp
- Be enrolled in a public school public charter school and agree to comply with the registration procedures and rules/regulations of the chosen camp

ABOUT SCOPE

SCOPE (Summer Camp Opportunities Promote Education) is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to provide children from underserved communities with life-changing opportunities through the experience of summer camp. SCOPE helps fund camp scholarships (camperships) to send children who commit to staying in school to nonprofit, resident camps which will empower them to develop to their full potential. SCOPE has funded over 20,000 camp scholarships since 1991.

SCOPE CAMPS

Residential, nonprofit camps that are accredited by the American Camp Association (ACA) may participate in SCOPE. All SCOPE camps commit to maintaining a high level of quality in facilities, program and staff, and to the Accreditation Standards of the ACA. Monies raised by SCOPE are distributed among SCOPE camps for allocation to eligible children. Although SCOPE sets the eligibility guidelines, each camp determines which children will be accepted into its program.
