Principals Update

Changes to be aware of as putting together goals for next year Changes around types of

- Typically in past include ELA/Math/School Environment goal and additional goals as needed
- 2023-2024, similar goals in iPlan portal; sharing of screen
 - Areas of difference Sec 5 Need to align goals with these new categories for shaping our CEP goals.
 - Priority 1 : All students learn to read well
 - o Priority 2: All students are physically and emotionally safe
 - Priority 3: All students have a high quality academic experience
 - Priority 4: All students graduate college and career ready and have a pathway to economic security
 - Priority 5: Redesign system to be more inclusive and responsive of parents and families
 - o Additional: Chronic absenteeism.
 - Our CEP Goals will now be in alignment with citywide priorities.
 - Discussion around clarification of Priority 5 on equity/inclusion
 - Ms. Emel we should keep in mind what data sources we are tapping into for each priority needs.
- Ms. Emel: Planning for next year CEP Goals can include goals that are connected to each other in the priorities

 Sept 2024?

- Expeditionary Learning is the new ELA curriculum to start in Sept 23 for K-8.
- Illustrative Mathematics new Math Curriculum; will use upcoming year to learn this new curriculum while continuing to use Envision (currently used); will transition in September '24.
- District 6 leadership made decisions in the district on these two new curriculums.

• Target Funding of Staff to support CEP Goals

- Need for reading intervention specialist in ES; will help support literacy
- Support from PTO/Friends of 187 to help fund positions, music/art
 - Part time? What does that look like , ie costs
- Pending 1st round of budgets for FY23/24 to be released to schools.
- Ms. Emel: Hiring Reading intervention specialist is similar costs to hiring an additional teacher
 - Other option: F Status Position status, retired teacher hired part time;
 rates vary depending on the person brought in.
 - Substitute teacher to be trained could be another option
 - Co Funding to consider longevity of the commitment from funding sources; consistency is key
- Hila: PTO alternative could be tutoring after school; IS students to help ES students
